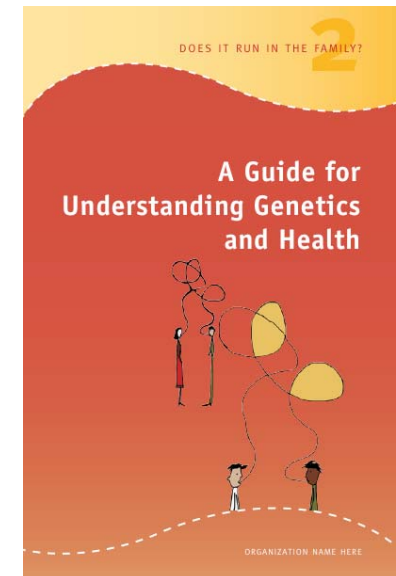
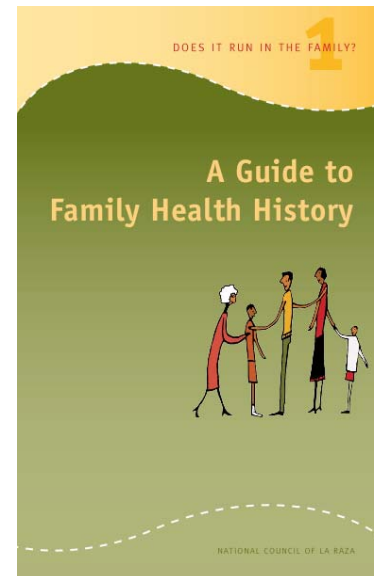


Goals & Objectives

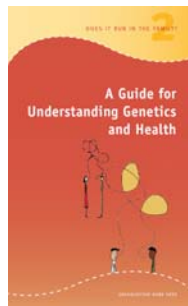
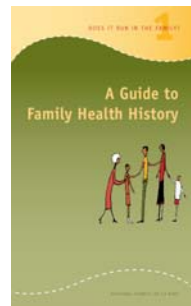
Grant Focus: *INTEGRATION* and *INNOVATION*



Applicants will be assessed based on how well they incorporate the *Does it Run in the Family?* Toolkit into their current system

Example Projects

- Distributing the tool in a mobile clinic
- Holding a grandparents' day event at a senior center
- Putting out a family health history service announcement
- Introducing the tool into ESL curricula
- Linking the tool to a condition-specific registry

Requirements

- Use the customizable online tool
- Perform an evaluation of its use
- Print booklets
- Create a dissemination plan
- Produce model project
- Write a final project report

Available Funding

- CCFHH has designated \$100,000 for June 2008 – May 2009 to distribute CCFHH Program Awards.
- Organizations may apply for up to \$10,000 as a base award.

We will fund:

- Projects serving a community, which is a population united by shared health conditions, race or ethnicity, geography, religion, age, gender, sexual orientation, environment, or culture
- Organizations located in and serving the United States and/or US territories

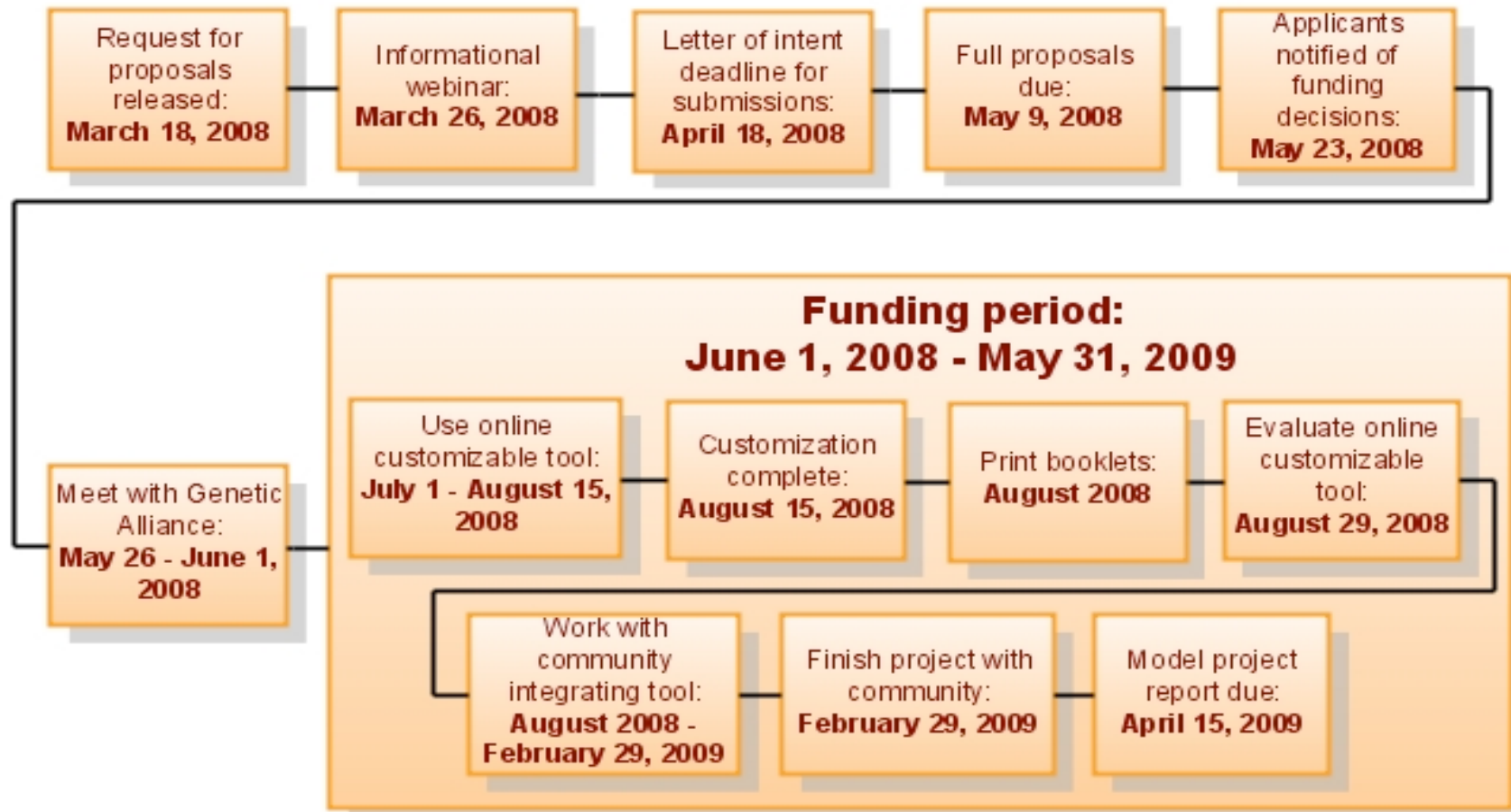
Full proposals must include:

- Proposal narrative (8 page limit)
- Work plan and timeline
- Budget with justification and indication of in kind funding
- Three letters of support
- Resumes of key personnel directly involved in this project

Narratives must:

- Clearly define the community to be served.
- Describe the program or system in which the tool will be used.
- Include a complete narrative description of the proposed program, including goals, objectives, activities, timelines, and anticipated outcomes.
